FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

What qualifications or experience do I need?

We welcome applicants with the following professional backgrounds: oncology nurses, general medicine practitioners, radiation oncologists, surgical oncologists, medical oncologists, and non-clinical professionals as health managers, aligning with the various areas covered in the training program. While prior experience in the field of training is preferred, we also encourage individuals with limited experience who possess the qualifications mentioned above to apply for participation in the program.

Can I participate in the training program if I have limited experience in training?

Basic knowledge in training and engagement of adult learners is only desirable, not mandatory.

What topics and skills will be covered during the training sessions?

How long is the training program, and what is the time commitment required?

The Train the Trainers curriculum is approximately 10 hours in length and will be available on the course platform between July 2024 to September 2025. In turn, specialised modules will be tailored to each participant's profile, each with a unique duration as shown in the Figure 1.

The commitment entails completing the training program and being available to serve as trainers during the pilot program scheduled to take place from September 2024 to September 2025 (optional).







Will I receive a certification upon completion of the program?

The course is accredited by ACOE (Accreditation Council of Oncology in Europe) and offers micro-credentials. Participants can earn CMEs (Continuing Medical Education) or CNEs (Continuing Nursing Education) depending on their pathway: 56 CMEs for Train the Trainers, 33 CMEs for General Practitioners, 49 CMEs for non-clinicals, 53 CMEs for Oncology Specialists, and 57 CNEs (accredited by EUAB-CNE) for nursing professionals.

How will the training sessions be conducted? Are they in-person, online, or a combination of both?

The program will be delivered online via an external Moodle platform, with optional in-person sessions. Our training methods include interactive presentations, lectures, case studies, and informative videos. Each program section is followed by self-assessment questions.

Are there instructors and facilitators leading the training sessions?

The course is taught online with self-learning resources. Both the module materials and the assessment activities are designed so that you can progress at your own pace and check your progress, learning autonomously. While you are taking the course you will have the support of an expert tutor to resolve any doubts and queries you may have.
