

DUTIES OF THE YOUNG CANCER PROFESSIONALS STEERING COMMITTEE

Given the European Cancer Organisation's (ECO) spirit of collective decision-making, shared objectives and success, ECO volunteers who are part of the Young Cancer Professionals Steering Committee must:

Specific duties:

- Advise on the strategy and policy activities of the Young Cancer Professionals Group
- Participate in at least two Steering Committee meetings per year
- Advise on agendas for the Young Cancer Professionals General Group meetings
- Participate in the European Cancer Summit and provide feedback on the session dedicated to the Young Cancer Professionals
- Advise on any projects relevant to the Young Cancer Professionals including Roundtables and strategic partnerships with other organisations
- Help to disseminate information and promote the Young Cancer Professionals to attract more members
- Take leadership, support and empower YCP activities in order to benefit Young Cancer Professionals throughout Europe

General duties:

- Ensure that the Young Cancer Professionals' activities and decisions align with ECO's overall vision, mission and strategic goals, and respect the YCP Terms of Reference
- Respect the values of ECO and observe the conditions of its Statutes and Internal Rules, and correct governance
- Fulfill their responsibilities in good faith, while exercising due diligence and prudence, in the best interests of ECO
- Not share or relate any matter dealt with at the level of the Young Cancer Professionals relating to ECO personnel, members, volunteers, or sponsors of ECO to anyone outside of YCP. This duty of confidentiality continues indefinitely even after their term has ended.
- Consider as confidential and therefore refrain from sharing any information pertinent to their position as Steering Committee member of the Young Cancer Professionals by any means of communication or on any social media platform.
